



How Can the Search Committee Find God's Man?

1. Pray that the search team will seek the face of God more than a pastor.

Their job is to find the heart and mind of God and not miss his wisdom when it is revealed to them. God loves this church so much that he sent his son to die for it. He has a plan to bring the right pastor for this exact moment in the life of His church. The search teams prayers should be, God show us the man you have chosen to lead us.

- 2. *Pray that the search team will surrender to the will of God, and not their own.* (or even our own will) If we took a poll and asked what the new pastor should be like, he would be one weird dude. God knows best. Proverbs 3:5-6
- 3. *Pray they will be people of wisdom looking on the heart, not on the outside.* Do not just select a pastor for looks, eloquent speech or degrees. Look only to the heart.
- 4. *Pray that they will hear from God with absolute clarity.* We don't know how it will happen but pray that God will knit the hearts of the team members and the pastor together in a special way when they meet.
- 5. *Pray the team will have a unity of spirit.* Romans 15:5-6. Pray that God will unify the team and together they will present God's choice to the church.
- 6. *Pray that God will prepare the pastor and his <u>family's</u> heart for a move.* God will stir in a man's heart; put restlessness in his soul that lets him know he is being called. We are calling a whole family, so pray that God prepares the hearts of the entire family.
- 7. When the pastor and the search team meet, pray that there will be a unique *comfortableness when the pastor and the search team sit down together.* Pray the spirit of God will create an immediate bond.
- 8. Pray that it will be abundantly clear that his gifts, background, and vision match the needs of our church. God has been preparing someone his whole life to lead our church at this moment. We should be craving to meet and encourage this new pastor. God has selected him for a certain reason and knows that this is who we need leading us.
- 9. Pray that the Lord will unite the hearts of the pastor and his wife, they will sense God's leadership, and explore the opportunity to lead FBC Tupelo.
- 10. Pray the pastor will hear God's call and respond joyfully and obediently. Pray God will speak clearly to him and his family that this is where they belong and they respond.

\$30,000 in labor provided through these great opportunities of ministry.



SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

Marigene O'Conner Taylor Fund The Marigene O'Conner Taylor Scholarship Fund will provide scholarships for the 2014 Fall Semester. If you have been a member of First Baptist Church of Tupelo, Mississippi, for at least two years and will be enrolled in an institution of higher learning (a minimum of six hours for the 2014 Fall Semester) you are eligible to apply for the scholarship.

Nursing Scholarships

Applicants who are pursuing a four-year nursing degree must be at least a third-year nursing student. Applicants pursuing a twoyear or three-year degree must be at least a second year nursing student. If you have been a member of First Baptist Church of Tupelo for at least two years and will be enrolled in an institution of higher learning (a minimum of 12 hours per semester) you are eligible to apply for the scholarship.

Adult with Dependent Scholarship If you will be enrolled in an institution of higher learning, or have decided to return to school to further your education, you are eligible to apply for this scholarship. Applicants must have a dependent, and a single parent will be given preference.

M.B. Holmes Memorial Trust This trust is for ministerial students only.

Applications for the above scholarships are in the church office. The deadline for receipt of the application is August 15, 2014.

Scholarships will be awarded no later than August 31, 2014.

Reading the Bible Through Together ... This month we move into the book of Acts and the beginning of the church. This is "part 2" of Luke's account of the story of Jesus, the coming of the Holy Spirit and the spread of the Gospel through the Church. Luke gives an account of the Salvation God offers starting in Jerusalem and spreading all the way to Rome. It begins with Jesus' statement that we will be His witnesses in all the world and the promise of the Holy Spirit. Following the ascension into heaven, Luke shares the story of Pentecost and details the working of the early church. We will read about Stephen, Peter's escape from prison and persecution of early believers. Luke will tell of the conversion of Saul/Paul and how he begins the missionary movement. One of the exciting things in this book is that the Good News is shared with Cornelius, a Gentile (that's us) and how the Gospel spreads to those outside the Jewish community. We will walk with Paul through three missionary journeys and will stay with him to his final days in prison in Rome. Though this account was most likely written as part of Luke's Gospel account, it gives us an historical account of the beginning of the Church and the ministry of Paul.

He shares with them his heart that Jews and Gentiles make up the church together. Romans is an incredibly influential book for all believers. It is a book filled with theology and encouragement for Christians. He tells the story of God's redemption in primarily theological terms. We will take our time reading through the book. May God bless and open our minds to understand this book.
